



#### Reading Between the Lines by Elsi Vassdal Ellis


I had written a short narrative in 2017 about a mother's burden of carrying secrets, the relationship of the secrets to shadows, and the passing those secrets onto her daughter. Photographs from my large vintage/antique shop finds with shadows were selected for the front layer of the pages. Each page has the same circular and barred pop-up with the text appearing behind the alternating bars of the circle that pop out. To complicate the reading of the secrets, a simple decoding of the text is required. This book is in an edition of 10 with variable color combinations as part of my Waste-Not-Want-Not series of using up materials sitting on shelves in my studio.







#### Behind Closed Doors by Dorothy McCuistion

"Behind Closed Doors" is about how we hide difficult personal situations beneath our public exteriors. We say "everything is fine", when it often isn't. Symbolized by the façade of a beautiful house, each panel hides a pain such as "eating disorder" or "addiction". I've selected only a few from a list of many possible life events that someone close to me has experienced recently or in the past. By talking about painful events, instead of keeping them secret, we can heal and we can help others heal.

Structure: accordion fold with belly band; cube folded inserts, pinhole words.

Materials: Heavy cotton paper covered with Japanese decorative paper and origami paper inserts.

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


#### Secrets by Abbie Birmingham



#### What Lies Within by LeeAnne Campos

Materials: Pilot Plumix Pen, Sharpie, Sakura Gelly Pens, Shizen 100% rag paper, Arches Watercolour Cold Pressed Paper, Winsor & Newton watercolors and gouache. Trifold w/sleeve, 4 ½" x 8". The very nature of Emily Dickinson's poem, J1748 "The reticent volcano" evokes secrecy. There is hidden meaning in her words; it's interesting to ponder her intent. The final phrase is truly thought provoking. I used pens of various sizes and black ink to create a stark contrast to the watercolors and gouache; an antique button from my grandmother's stash seals the sleeve.

#### Don't Keep Secrets by Debbi Commodore

Everyone has a few, sometimes we let one slip. If you choose to reveal a secret could a flower help you spill the beans? Are flowers more than their beauty? Can they convey a message secrecy? Flowers have been used as a symbolic means of communication for thousands of years. During the 19th century interest soured in Victorian England and the US. The intricate system of floral symbolism, florigraphy, in which each flower is assigned a specific meaning was inspired by the Turkish custom of sélam. As Mary Wortley Montague, wife of the British ambassador in Constantinople (18th century) said, "There is no flower without a verse belonging to it; and it is possible to quarrel, reproach, or send letters of passion, friendship, or civility, or even of news without even inking your fingers."


#### Don't Divide by Esther Ervin




